The first part of the course covers research design issues, theoretical assumptions, and justifications for mixed methods. The second and third parts deal with the qualitative and quantitative perspective in a mixed methods research design, respectively. The fourth part explores advanced theoretical and practical problems and solutions to mixed methods research.
